FYI from Cst Peter Jeon, Manotick CPC

As of May 1, 2009, if you are found to have a blood alcohol concentration from 0.05 to 0.08 (the "warn range") while driving, you will: have your driver's license suspended for three days the first time you are caught; have your driver's license suspended for seven days and have to attend an alcohol education program the second time you are caught; and have your driver's license suspended for 30 days, complete a remedial alcohol treatment program, and have an ignition interlock condition placed on your driver's license for six months after the third infraction. On top of a driver license suspension, insurance companies may investigate the suspension and reassess insurance rates accordingly.

(Ottawa) - The Ottawa Police Service is investigating a robbery that occurred at a Shoppers Drug Mart located in the 400 block of Hazeldean Road in Kanata. Shortly after 9:00 pm on February 28, 2010 a lone suspect entered the store and demanded cash. The suspect received an undisclosed amount of cash and fled the scene.

The suspect is described as: Male, white, approximately 40 years old, 177 - 178 cm (5'9"- 5'10") with a muscular build. He was wearing a black hooded jacket, grey track pants, black bandana and sunglasses.

(Ottawa) - The Ottawa Police Service has charged an adult male following a robbery in the 3000 block of Strandherd Drive.

On December 17, 2009, at approximately 1:40 pm, a lone male entered the Shoppers Drug Mart situated in the 3000 block of Strandherd Drive. He approached the pharmacy counter and produced a note indicating that he had a weapon and wanted oxycontin. There was no weapon seen. The suspect fled with an undisclosed amount of narcotics prior to police arrival. Witnesses provided police with a description of the getaway vehicle.

On February 25, 2010, an Ottawa man was arrested in connection with this robbery. Samir AYAD, 19-years-old of Ottawa, is charged with one count of Robbery, one count of Conspiracy to commit an indictable offence, one count of Accessory and one count of Fail to comply with conditions of undertaking. He is scheduled to appear in court on February 26, 2010.

Two other suspects remain outstanding. One of the suspects is described as a black male, approximately 171 cm (5'7"), 17-19 years-old, wearing a black toque, dark coloured scarf and a black winter jacket. There is no description available for the second suspect.

Joint Services Drug Operation: Project "MIDNIGHT"-- a success

(Ottawa) - At a news conference earlier today, a Joint Police Operation involving the Royal Canadian Mounted Police (RCMP), the Ottawa Police Service (OPS), the Ontario Provincial Police (OPP) and the Service de Police de la Ville de Montréal (SPVM) announced the conclusion of a 12 month drug investigation called Project "MIDNIGHT".  
On Thursday, February 25, 2010, ten (10) search warrants were executed in the City of Ottawa under the authority of the Criminal Code of Canada. The search warrants were executed in residences and business locations. Members of the Ottawa Police Service Tactical Unit assisted in some of the entries. Project "MIDNIGHT" effected a total of 68 charges against 10 persons. The 68 charges include conspiracy to traffic controlled substances, possession of controlled substances for the purpose of trafficking, trafficking controlled substances, participating in a

criminal organization and possession of proceeds of crime.

Project Midnight - Drug warrants addresses

Project "MIDNIGHT", a joint effort consisting of the Royal Canadian Mounted Police, the Ottawa Police Service, the Ontario Provincial Police and the Service de Police de la Ville de Montréal, commenced in the month of February 2009 as an investigation into an Ottawa based Organized Crime Group involved in the trafficking and distribution of large amounts of Cocaine and other controlled substances throughout the Ottawa area.

Throughout the investigation, surveillance techniques, seizures of drugs intended for distribution and the execution of search warrants assisted in identifying the persons charged as being responsible for the distribution of at least 100 kilograms of cocaine (street value: \$10,000,000.00) onto the streets of the City of Ottawa between February 2009 and February 2010. Police identified persons living in the City of Montréal as being responsible for the supply of cocaine to the Ottawa group.

To date, 2.1 million dollars worth of cocaine, \$330,000 worth of cannabis resin (hashish) and \$430,000.00 in Canadian currency has been seized by investigators.

Detective Inspector Ian Grant of the Ontario Provincial Police Organized Crime Enforcement Bureau said: "'Project Midnight' is an excellent example of how the cooperative efforts of law enforcement agencies can be successful and have significant impact when investigating major criminal groups. In today's environment it is important to combine resources and target criminal elements that negatively impact the safety and security of our communities."

"The fight against Drugs and Organized Crime is an ongoing process, the RCMP will continue to pursue in

partnership especially with our partners in law enforcement in a effective, integrated and coordinated approach," said Royal Canadian Mounted Police, Inspector Denis Roy "A" Division A/ OIC Organized Crime and Border Integrity.

"The Ottawa Police Service remains focussed and determined to continue the battle against organized crime groups," said Inspector Jill Skinner, Ottawa Police Service, Special Operations Section. "Doing so with the strong support of Provincial and Federal partners such as was the case in Project Midnight, proves that working together yields strong and positive results."
